Dr. Kristine Coreil has been a member of the faculty of Northwestern State University since the fall of 1994, teaching horn and music theory, and conducting the Natchitoches Northwestern Horn Choir. Dr. Coreil received the Doctor of Musical Arts in Horn Performance degree from the University of Wisconsin in Madison, studying with horn professor Douglas Hill; the Master of Music in Horn Performance degree from Northwestern University, studying with Dale Clevenger; and the Bachelor of Music Education degree from Northwestern State University, studying with Richard Jennings. She has played with numerous



orchestras, including the Wisconsin Chamber Orchestra, the Beloit-Janesville (WI) Symphony Orchestra, the Cabrillo Con-

temporary Music Festival Orchestra in Santa Cruz, CA, the Longview (TX) Symphony, the Texarkana Symphony, the Meridian (MS) Symphony, and the Rapides (LA) Symphony. She is a current member of the Shreveport Symphony, having played in the horn section for the past thirteen years. She is also an avid soloist, performing solo and chamber recitals annually. She has been invited to perform solo recitals at venues in Manchester, England; Brussels, Belgium; and in Louisiana, Oklahoma, Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Mississippi, Illinois, Wisconsin, North Carolina, Kansas, and Michigan. Karl Kemm earned a bachelor's degree at the University of New Mexico. He studied music history and performance practice at the University of New Hampshire for a master's degree under the guidance of Keith Polk and the renowned music iconography specialist Mary Rasmussen. In 1989 he joined the Air Force Bands program and also began freelancing in the San Francisco Bay Area. He remains associated with the Air Force through the Texas Air National Guard Band. Recently he freelanced as an orchestral and early music natural horn player throughout Texas and the neighboring states. While pursuing Doctoral work with Teaching Fellow duties at the University of North Texas he also served as an adjunct faculty member at Texas Woman's University and principal horn with the Abilene Philharmonic. He currently holds the third horn position with the Corpus Christi Symphony. At Del Mar he teaches horn and Introduction to the Humanities.
